
### Classic Movies at the Marquis Theatre



To the uninitiated, the historic Village is a 19th-century jewel in Northville's crown. Seven buildings, ranging from approximately 1831 to the 1890's, have carefully been moved from various parts of Northville to the scenic park land on Griswold Street; two more have been meticulously reconstructed with the aid of period photographs and plans.

A visit to the Village is a delightful way to explore the past, take a pleasant stroll, and step back in time. Mill Race Village is open to all, and there is no admission charge. It's located on Griswold, just east of Downtown Northville, between Main Street and Eight Mile Road. The grounds are open daily from sunrise to sunset; the buildings are open on Sunday afternoons.
